Event No	Event Type	Description
EV5960	Archaeological Evaluation: Winchburgh Masterplan Area - Block Y	No details. CFA's report of the results of the evaluation records that cultivation furrows identified in around half of the trenches excavated. There was no evidence that the rig-and-furrow cultivation was of more than one phase. No features of archaeological significance were identified during the evaluation.
EV5430	Archaeological Excavation: Block Aa, Winchburgh Masterplan, Beatlie Road, Winchburgh, West Lothian	The excavation uncovered the remains of a sub-circular, double-ditched enclosure with an overall measurement of 64 m north west-south east by 67 m north west-south east. The internal area of the enclosure measured 43.5 m north east-south west by 39 m north west-south east. There was a lack of artefacts such as pottery to assist with initial thoughts about dating and function but the recovery of a number of shale artefacts that have been initially interpreted as deriving from the manufacture of shale bracelets tends to support the proposed later prehistoric date for this enclosure.
Ev5049	Archaeological Evaluation: Winchburgh Masterplan Area, Block Aa, Winchburgh, West Lothian	Rig and furrow was identified in a number of trenches, and a sub-rectangular fire pit exposed. The evaluation confirmed the presence of a substantial oval double-ditched enclosure, identified previously as a parch-mark on aerial photographs.
